Aaron Bostel acknowledged that five of seven students in the EMT class passed the National Registry Exam. The other two are scheduled to take the exam. Seven new staff members were onboarded as a result of the first training class. He also announced Barbour County Ambulance Authority won the Best Equipped BLS Unit at the Mountain State Forest Festival.

Jody Carpenter recognized National 4-H week. He presented office space availability at Battlers Knob that consists of 1,483 sq. ft. for \$1,500.00 per month and an additional 1,040 sq. ft. for \$500.00; water, electric and trash included. David Strait made a motion to pursue the lease with Battlers Knob for the purpose of Barbour County Extension Service office space; Jedd Schola seconded. 3/0

Jonathan Liston followed up on County participation with Globe Life. Due to a lack of motion, Globe Life will not be an approved optional benefit.

Commissioner Strait discussed additional damage to Charles Nestor's poultry. It was noted that modifications and improvements are being completed in an effort to prevent future occurrences. Commissioner Strait appreciates his willingness to discuss the matter with him and noted that Mr. Nestor has donated the first \$250.00 in damage reimbursement to the Shop with a Cop program. On a motion by David Strait, seconded by Bob Richardson, reimbursement of \$500.00 was approved to Charles Nestor for the loss of additional poultry as a result of a dog escaping from the county shelter. 3/0
